Tekst 2.

In September 1991 scientists began a fascinating experiment. Four men and four women entered Biosphere 2 – a miniature Earth consisting of interconnected buildings constructed from steel, glass and concrete in the American state of Arizona. They were expected to live there for two years. The main idea behind the experiment was simple. Biosphere 2 was designed with one particular aim in mind: to test whether human beings could survive in a closed environment that recreated conditions similar to those found in nature, without any interference from outside. Now almost forgotten, at the beginning, the experiment received a lot of media attention in the United States and across the world. Crowds watched the participants being locked inside the miniature Earth.

Scientists had created Biosphere 2 with a man-made rainforest, desert, grassland and even a small ocean. The air and water inside were reused. The participants grew vegetables, rice and other foods they needed to survive. They also kept farm animals which provided meat, eggs and milk.

Creating a prototype of "a new Earth" from scratch proved quite challenging. At some point the eight test subjects, called "Biospherians", faced an unexpected problem. The group's health began to be affected by low oxygen levels, so air had to be pumped in from outside. This decision led to criticism of the \$150 million project, because it turned out that Biosphere 2 wasn't able to support life in the long run and the project ended in September 1993.

The researchers didn't totally give up, though. In 1994, after improvements were made to Biosphere 2, the experiment was replicated with a new group of subjects. But it had to be stopped six months later because of money issues. Then, over the following years, the ownership of Biosphere 2 changed several times. Today, the University of Arizona operates the buildings which serve as a scientific research centre for controlled studies. Researchers from around the world can now use the facility to carry out experiments.

Zadanie 3.
